

Planetarium enthusiasts meeting

This session will spotlight people who are passionate and active about planetariums in various ways.

The Lore of the World's Stars

Even though we look up at the same sky on Earth, each culture and region has different interpretations and stories of the stars. Through introducing and sharing such star lore from around the world, we will understand the values of the sky shared by diverse cultures.

Planetariums and the Space Development Business

Until now, space development has been mainly undertaken by national organizations. However, in recent years, various private companies have entered the space development business. We will use planetariums to inform the general public about this new space business, and consider new programs in collaboration with such companies and the development of human resources who will be responsible for space development in the future through these programs.

History of Japanese Planetariums and the Popularization of Astronomy from national and international perspectives

In Japan, the first planetarium was introduced in Osaka in 1937. Planetariums have spread throughout the country, and there are currently about 300 in operation. These planetariums have enriched Japan's starry sky culture through a wide range of educational, cultural, and entertainment activities. This presentation will focus on the diversity and evolution of Japan's planetariums, while unraveling the history of planetariums in Japan. Also closely related to planetariums are Japan's public observatories, now in their 100th year of existence, and their activities to promote astronomy. We will introduce how they have contributed to cultivating citizens' curiosity about science and science through astronomy, and discuss the next 100 years with you.

Japanese Anime Culture and Planetariums

Japanese animation and related culture are highly popular throughout the world. Japanese planetariums are taking unique approaches, such as showing films in collaboration with the latest popular animations.

This special session will focus on the fusion of anime culture and planetariums.




